The German Help assists primarily persons of German nationality who face problems while staying in Thailand. The German Help offers consultation and help to children and youth, the elderly, and prisoners. We also visit people in hospitals and at home.

Although the German Help is not a part of the German Embassy, it operates in close cooperation with the Embassy. Other institutions, such as the two German church communities, also cooperate with The German Help.



In September 2006, the German Help Thailand began as an initiative of the former German Ambassador in Bangkok, Dr. Christoph Bruemmer. The German Help currently has about 60 members and serves charitable purposes. Based in Berlin, it is registered with the district court Charlottenburg/Berlin under registration number VR 26074 B. The German Help has the right to issue donation receipts which are tax-deductible in Germany. The registration in Thailand took place under ๑๗๓ 1/2551 at the Ministry of Labor. The German Help is financed by corporate and private donations, including fundraising events. The principal source of fundraising income is the "Fest der Deutschen". This celebration of German National Day is under the patronage of the German Embassy and the German-Thai Chamber of Commerce.

How we help

- Our aim is to help individuals solve their problems and prevent the reoccurrence of similar problems.
- All requests will be considered.
- Consultation and information will be provided in order to enable individuals to help themselves.
- Individuals are expected to cooperate by providing documented evidence of both the development of the problem and the current needs.
- The German Help will facilitate contact with other agencies and individuals including family and friends who are able to help the individual.
- The director of The German Help in Bangkok is authorized to provide financial help in emergencies within a small budget. For assistance in Chiang Mai and Phuket, contact the German Honorary Consuls.
- Requests involving substantial financial assistance will be carefully considered by a committee of the German Help before any amount will be granted.
- Individuals must be prepared and willing to repay the German Help for any loan.
- Long-term payments are beyond the scope of the association. The need to relocate to Germany will be considered.
- Volunteers with The German Help do not receive any compensation for their service except expenses related to transportation, telephone calls, etc.
- Our key concern is transparency. Audits of accounts are available for the public.
